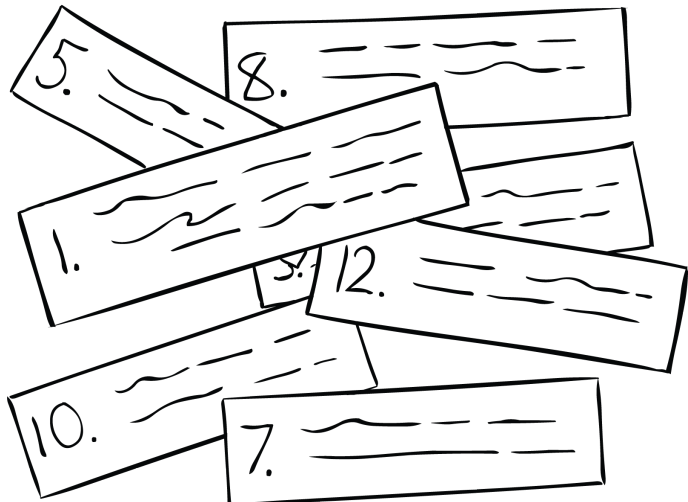
Twelve ready-to-print clues follow this page, on three pages.
